Visit <a href="https://lhi.care/covidtesting">https://lhi.care/covidtesting</a> to schedule an appointment. Nevada Residents can call 888-634-1123 to schedule an appointment. Testing can be conducted every two weeks. Surveillance testing will allow public health officials to monitor the spread of COVID-19,

while also keeping us on track to move forward in reopening our community.
