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# Re: Newsletter and Board of Education Meeting September 22

Good afternoon LTUSD friends and families.

Happy Friday! Let's hope for more rain and clean air to give our firefighters some respite and allow us to play outside! Well, the third eventful week of distance learning is under our belts and I must say that it just keeps getting better! As we continue to dial this system in, continue to learn from each other, and continue to get comfortable with our screen selves (flat-faced and flipped), we can't help but improve on this extraordinary experience. The District thanks its families and staff profusely for your patience and support.

Monday marks the 4th week of the first 6-week phase of Distance Learning as outlined in the Pandemic Educational Plan adopted on July 30, 2020. In accordance with the Plan, an assessment of current COVID-19 data and information will begin on September 21, to determine if the criteria for movement to Phase 2 Hybrid Model can be met. Superintendent Todd Cutler, Ed.D., will present the most up-to-date data and information available at the Board meeting on Tuesday, September 22.

A Regular Board of Education meeting is scheduled for 6:00 pm Tuesday, September 22, 2020 (with Closed Session at 5:00pm) Here is a link to the full agenda. (Click on 9/22/20 in the right column.) The summary agenda is attached. The meeting will be conducted virtually via Zoom and all public participation will be handled remotely. MEAL DELIVERY SCHEDULE - Breakfast and lunch is now offered to all children ages 0-18 at no charge through December 2020. Routes will be updated as needed. Buses will distribute meals at each bus stop listed and will depart bus stops at the designated time. If students or parents miss the delivery, they may go to Bijou, Sierra House, Tahoe Valley or the Middle School between the hours of 12pm & 2PM to pick up meals. South Tahoe Now - Friday bags will be available to qualified families at four school sites (Sierra House, Bijou, Tahoe Valley and South Tahoe Middle School) and school bus stop locations every Friday. Weekend food bags can also be picked up from Choices for Children's office located at 1029 Takela Drive, Ste. #1.

<u>October</u> - Now, more than ever, it's important to get a flu shot: \$10 fee per vaccine; no one will be denied service due to inability to pay - Cash or check accepted; no appointment needed; Six months of age and up. Please wear face covering and physical distancing is required.

**Back-to-School Immunizations** - Childhood immunizations are <u>required</u> for students in California public school - please be sure your child's shots are up to date. Students will not be admitted to campus for in-person instruction without meeting the legal immunization requirements. Lake Tahoe Unified School District saves taxpayers \$3.3M by refinancing bonds – South Tahoe Now/Tahoe Daily Tribune - The Lake Tahoe Unified School District (LTUSD) was able to refinance \$15.15 million in general obligation bonds in September, saving property owners in the district \$3,335,698 in property taxes. With low interest rates brought about by the pandemic and economic uncertainty, LTUSD refinanced two series of their Election of 2008 General Obligation Bonds.

<u>Tahoe Valley School creates Family Literacy Garden</u> – South Tahoe Now - A summer-long project at Tahoe Valley Elementary School is now open to the public and the tree at the center of the love-filled efforts is in memory of student Marianna Zepeda. The quiet, reflective garden area includes seating, a lending library and a tree dedicated to Marianna, a 4th grade student who passed away June 19.
