Good afternoon LTUSD friends and families,

The first week of the elementary hybrid schedule went very smoothly! Kudos to the staff and parents for their positive attitudes and amazing teamwork to make these special "first days" exciting and happy for our students. You couldn't see the smiles on their mouths, but you could certainly see them in their eyes! Let's keep up the momentum and with that, we remind families and staff to continue to use the COVID-19 self-screening tool daily and follow the CDC recommendations for selecting, wearing, and cleaning your masks (Spanish).

Yes on Prop 15. On Tuesday, the Board of Education adopted a <u>resolution in support</u> of Proposition 15: Schools and Communities First Funding Act in 2020, and asked for the community to vote in favor of Prop 15 on November's ballot. Prop 15, if passed, would bring approximately \$2.4 million to Lake Tahoe Unified School District, at a time when funding couldn't be more important. Our schools were already facing serious budget constraints before the pandemic, but now, after the pandemic, budget shortfalls are a stark reality.

At Tuesday's meeting, trustees pointed out there is a lot of misinformation out there about Prop 15. In short, Prop 15 would close property tax loopholes for wealthy corporations and reclaim billions in commercial property taxes to be used to invest in California's schools and communities. This would affect commercial properties valued at over \$3 million and would *not affect* homeowners, renters, small businesses and agricultural land. In fact, a study by Blue Sky Consulting found that Prop 15 will actually save California homeowners hundreds of millions of dollars on their property tax bills every year.
