Good afternoon LTUSD friends and families,

Happy Friday and happy snowy weekend ahead - it's been awhile! Congratulations to South Tahoe Middle School's very successful start to in-person learning this week! There was so much excitement in the school - everyone bright-eyed and bushy-tailed, and the kids navigated the one-way halls like, "ok, whatever, just happy to be here!" As we look forward to beginning the hybrid schedule at our high schools on November 30, we find ourselves approaching another benchmark for consideration of movement between phases in accordance with the Pandemic Educational Plan. The district is reviewing the criteria, looking at the most up-to-date COVID-19 data available, and expects to announce next steps on Monday, Nov. 9.

The District is well-aware that cases are on the rise here in South Lake Tahoe, especially after Halloween weekend, and so we remind everyone to please do your part, act responsibly, wear masks and distance yourself 6ft, even in small social settings, to prevent the spread. We can get past this latest setback, and learn from it, by practicing appropriate pandemic behaviors going forward. It's not impossible to stamp out COVID-19 in our community, but we must act collectively and responsibly. As always, we remind all families to continue to use the <u>self-screening tool</u> <u>daily</u> and follow the <u>CDC recommendations for selecting, wearing, and cleaning your masks</u> (<u>Spanish</u>).
