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Re: Notice of Return to Hybrid; LTUSD Newsletter; and Board Meeting on January 26

Good afternoon LTUSD community,

We have good news to share with you. We are cautiously optimistic about a return to in-person learning in the Phase 2 hybrid structure, in grades TK through 8, on Monday, February 1, 2021. The district has been monitoring the local COVID-19 data and case numbers have been stable or trending down, including decreasing cases among our staff, over the last several days. As long as our community continues to stay on this course, we anticipate a safe and healthy return to the classroom on February 1. Masks will continue to be required, as well as social distancing, smiles, elbow-bumps, conversation, laughter, and learning.

As we prepare to welcome students back we will send information on school schedules, transportation, and meal service, so please check your email regularly. Please also be aware that if there is a dramatic rise in cases, or a sudden outbreak among our staff, the February 1 target could be delayed. Again, we remain optimistic and hopeful that the numbers stay stable and that we can move forward as a community, in support of our children.

Unfortunately we are still unable to foresee an opening date for the high school. By the current order of the State, our county must move into the "Red Tier" and remain there for two weeks prior to opening the campus to in-person learning. The moment we are in the red, the countdown will begin!

A SARC can be an effective way for a school to report on its progress in achieving goals. The public may also use a SARC to evaluate and compare schools on a variety of indicators. The SARC contains data on the following: demographics, school safety and climate, academic, completion rates, class sizes, teacher and staff information, curriculum and instruction, postsecondary preparation information and fiscal and expenditure.

<u>Kiwanis of Tahoe Sierra helping children in South Lake Tahoe</u> – South Tahoe Now - The Kiwanis Club of Tahoe Sierra has been busy this winter with helping the children of South Lake Tahoe. Club members started the season by providing snow pants and boots to children in the Tahoe Head Start program, knowing that every child deserves the opportunity to keep warm as they play in the snow. Inconsistent vaccine supply, lack of state coordination complicate vaccinating school staff – EdSource - El Dorado, a county east of Sacramento, with a total population of 193,000 people and 3,500 school employees, is further ahead than many in the state. School staff in the county began receiving their first doses of the vaccine last week. While it will likely take until mid-February to vaccinate all school employees who want it, county Superintendent of Schools Ed Manansala is optimistic. "The sense

of hope and promise in El Dorado County, it shifted this week," he said. "When you start seeing people having access to vaccinations within our sector — the education sector — this is good news."

NIXLE - Parent Texting Network from Drug Free Coalition As a parent, you are naturally concerned about your children's safety. As they grow older, one of those concerns centers on their potential exposure to drugs/substances of abuse and possible addiction.
