Re: LTUSD Newsletter and Board Meeting on February 9

Good afternoon LTUSD community,

We had a very successful restart of the hybrid schedule in our K-8 schools this week and it was such a joy to see the kids! Their energy and excitement incites a sense of rejuvenation and anticipation of happy times ahead! The District again wants to ensure parents, students and staff that its primary focus is on safe learning environments in our schools. All school sites continue to practice stringent precautionary measures in both behavior (mask wearing, social distancing, hand washing/sanitizing, directional foot traffic, maintaining cohorts) and facilities (air purification systems, fresh air when possible, desks spaced 6ft, daily cleaning and disinfecting, and systems maintenance). Our local and county-wide cases continue to decline and the district remains optimistic that this trend will soon allow for the reopening of the high school campuses.

The District and all school websites have been down for 24 hours due to a widespread server issue with our web hosting service. They are working on it but there is no estimated repair time. Therefore the current meal service / delivery schedule during hybrid is attached below.

A Regular Board of Education meeting is scheduled for 6:00 pm Tuesday, February 9, 2021 (with Closed Session at 5:00pm) Here is a link to the full agenda. (Click on 2/9/21 in the right column.) The meeting will be conducted in person by Board Members and administrators, and public participation will be held remotely pursuant to California's Stay At Home Order as well as Reopening Framework recommending social distancing of 6 feet.
