Dear Staff, Students, Parents/Guardians and Community Members,

We are very excited to begin our 2021-2022 School Year! It has been a challenging three weeks with the Caldor Fire evacuations. We are so thankful for our community, first responders, and fire fighters that came from locally and far and wide. We are also anxious to get this school year started, see our students and our colleagues, and begin what is going to be a fantastic school year!

COVID-19 continues to be a virus of great concern, the common DELTA variant is easily transmissible and we are committed to putting in place all of the prevention practices that will keep our children in school and our schools open.

The State of California has released requirements for student masking in indoor classrooms for all school programs during the 2021/2022 school year. CDPH continuously updates their guidance (the most current guidance updated on September 9, 2021) and you may follow this LINK to read all of the updates. LTUSD will continue to adapt and modify their requirements accordingly.

At this time LTUSD will follow these policies and procedures for all students and staff:

- Masks are required for ALL students and staff indoors regardless of vaccination status and should be worn over the nose and mouth at all times.
- Masks are optional (though encouraged) outdoors (students will be able to take breaks from wearing their masks when outside).
- Students and staff who forget their masks will be provided with one
- Students who do not wish to wear a mask, will not be allowed to participate in indoor on campus instruction during the 2021-2022 school year
- Staff and students who exhibit symptoms of illness are immediately sent home and asked to isolate with their family, contact their primary health care provider, and get a Covid test.
- Staff and students who test positive are immediately notified by the testing agency and then asked to report to their school nurse so that the school can begin the work of contact-tracing anyone the student or staff was in close contact with.
- Require students and staff to stay home and recommend getting tested if they are displaying any of the following symptoms:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell

- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion
- Inability to wake or stay awake
- Advise staff members and students with symptoms of COVID-19 infection not to return for in-person instruction until they have met CDPH criteria to return to school. Please contact your school nurse for guidance if you are having any symptoms of COVID-19:
