BUS RIDERSHIP RULES & REGULATIONS:

Bus Conduct Rules

The following is a partial list of bus conduct rules:

- <u>USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES IS NOT ALLOWED ON THE BUS</u>. Electronic devices may include, but not be limited to, <u>CELL PHONES</u>, hand held electronic games, net books,
- 2. Students are **Required** to stay in their seats facing forward while being transported on the bus.

The driver may assign student's seats.

Backpacks should be placed on the lap of the student, not on the floor.

- 3. Eating, drinking, chewing gum, or smoking will **not** be allowed on the buses.
- 4. No part of the body may be extended out of the windows.
- 5. Skateboards, bundles of newspapers, cans, balloons of any kind or glass are not allowed on buses at any time
- 6. If any item cannot be comfortably carried on student's lap, it is prohibited from the bus.
- 7. Pets or other animals may not be transported on the bus.
- 8. Students are not permitted to interfere with other students or their property.
- 9. Screaming, shouting, playing loud music, or causing any unnecessary loud noise will not be allowed.
- 10. Profane language, throwing of articles, shooting rubber bands, scuffling or any other unnecessary commotion, or disturbance

is not permitted.

- 11. Students are to refrain from touching other students; fighting and horseplay and public displays of affection (such as kissing, cuddling) are prohibited.
- 12. Students defacing buses, in any way, will be required to pay for damages and may lose bus riding privileges.
- 13. Students are not to deface private property on or near bus stops.
- 14. Students may not tamper with or operate any of the equipment on the bus unless instructed to do so by the driver in an

emergency situation.

- 15. Cleats or spikes may not be worn on the bus.
- 16. In the event of an emergency evacuation, students will remain with the bus until district transportation is provided. Students

may be released only to parent/guardian or authorized agent.

17. Any behavior which is not considered to be in compliance with safe riding practices will be subject to citation and possible loss of riding privileges.

The cooperation of all pupils and parents is requested to the end that pupils being transported under school authority shall be guaranteed the greatest possible safety. Pupils must realize that the safety of their own lives as well as those of their schoolmates depend upon cooperative bus conduct.

<u>Failure to comply with safe riding practices may result in the loss of the privilege of riding the bus.</u>

Bus Stop Regulations

1. Students should arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes prior to pick-up time. Students are not allowed to cross the street

within the sight of a bus driver unless the flashing red lights are activated by the driver. Students should not wait on the

opposite side of the street from the bus stop unless told to do so by the bus driver.

2. Students are to stay out of the street and wait in an orderly manner. Students are subject to the transportation discipline

policy while waiting for a bus.

- 3. Students will only be dropped off or picked up on the same side of the street as the bus stop.
- 4. Buses will make designated stops only.
- 5. Parents should not flag down or drive in front of a bus in order to stop it. Buses are not allowed to stop at any place other than a designated school bus stops.
- 6. Students are not to deface private property at or near bus stops.
